

Make your Own Potting Table

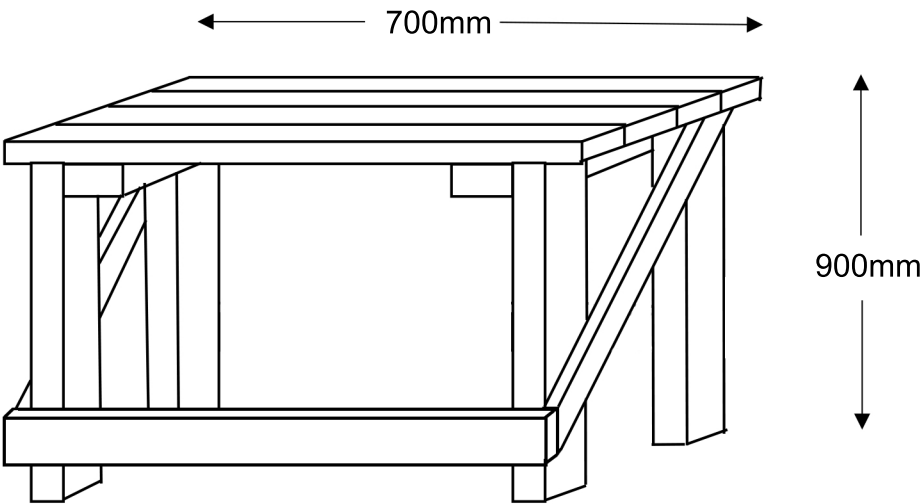
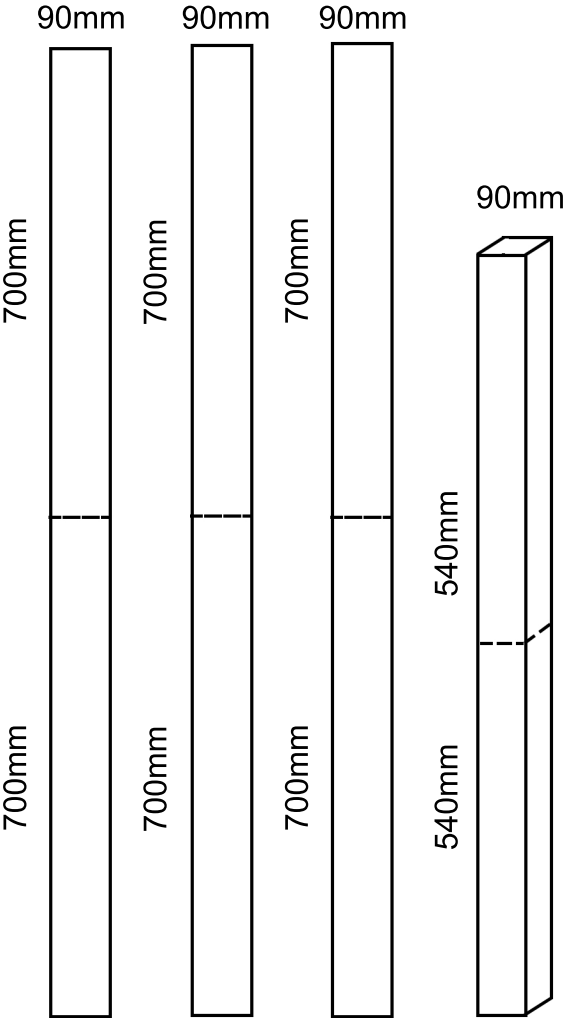
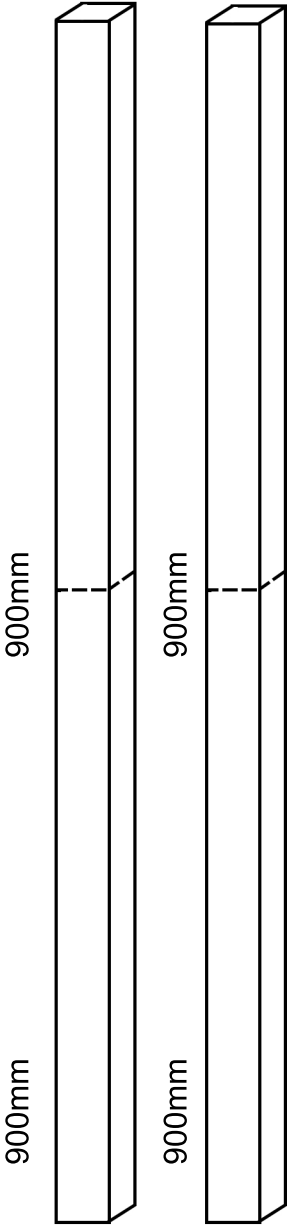


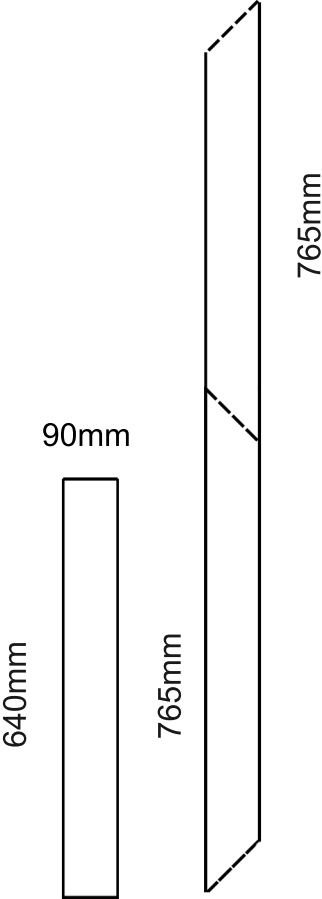
Table Top

What You Will Need

- Wood

- Six pieces 700mm long, 90mm wide and 20mm thick
- One piece 640mm long, 90mm wide and 20mm thick
- Two pieces 765mm long, 90mm wide and 20mm thick
- Two pieces 540mm long, 90mm wide and 90mm thick
- Four pieces 900mm long, 90mm wide and 90mm thick

- Pencil and Tape Measure
- Saw
- Eight screws 120mm long
- Twenty-two screws 60mm long
- Clamps
- Drill

Step 1 Location

Decide where you are going to put your potting table and make sure there is plenty of space for it.

Step 2 Wood

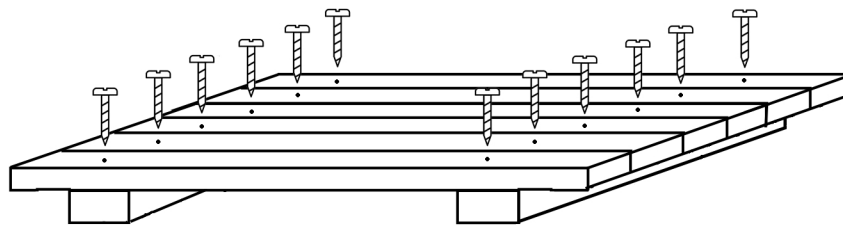
Source your wood. You can reuse scrap pieces of wood or use wood from a pallet, but make sure it is strong enough, with no major splits and hasn't gone rotten.

Step 3 Measure and Cut

The wood sizes are a guide, lengths and thickness may vary depending on the wood you have. Use a tape measure and pencil to mark on the wood where to cut. Use a saw to cut the different length of wood. Cut the two 765mm long pieces at 45°, you can use the handle of a saw to mark the angle.

Step 4 Attach the Table Top

Place the six 700mm pieces of wood on top of the two 540mm long pieces, leaving a 50mm space from the edge. Clamp the pieces together as you use the 60mm long screws and drill to attach.



Step 5 Attach the Legs

Clamp one end of the 900mm long pieces to the outside of the 540mm length under the table top, matching the edge of the legs, with the edge of the table top. Use two 120mm long screws and a drill, to attach. Repeat for the other three legs.

Step 6 Attach the Supports

Attach the angled 765mm supports to the outside of the legs on the left and right, with two 60mm screws on each leg. One end of the angled supports should rest on the underneath of the table top. Then attach the 640mm support to the legs at the back, again with two 60mm screws in each leg. This piece should join the two angled pieces together.

Step 7 Paint

Use an outdoor wood paint or stain on the table to help preserve the wood for longer.
